

The Arise of the name Uiterwijk Winkel

We go back to the year 1708 when on September, 1708 in Hoogeveen (drenthe), Koert Albertz Winkel was baptized. His parents were Albert Koertz, born around 1680, and mergien Arentz. In baptism-register in Hoogeveen is Koert Albertz always mentioned without the name Winkel added, but after February 20, 1746 his name is always added. It seems that he adopted te name "Winkel" around the year 1745, we don't know really why he did this, but in doing so, he became the forefather of all the "Winkels" in Hoogeveen.

In circa 1732, Koert Albertz Winkel married Albertien Jans Kuiper, who was baptized in Hoogeveen on May 26, 1709. She gave birth to nine children, two of which died prematurely. Albertien Jans Kuiper died between March 13, 1748 and November 27, 1751. The under age children were put in tutelage to Jan Uiterwijk, their guardian. (MP2fol206 ev) As is done at the present time members of the family were approached to take up the position of guardian to the children.

Jan Uiterwijk mentioned himself that the was born in Hoogeveen; when he was 40 years old (August 15, 1751) he witnessed a distrubance of a church service (Echtens Morgenland 166) He must then have born around 1710-1711. Jan Uiterwijk married Geesje Jans Kuiper, who was born in Hoogeveen on May 17, 1711 and who died in the same town on March 14, 1777. She was by then known as Geesje Jans Uiterwijk. She was a sister of Koert Albertz Winkel's first wife. Koert Albertz Winkel and Jan Uiterwijk thus were brothers-in-law. The other guardians (momers) were all related to Koert Albertz Winkel. (M.P. Echtens HGV fol 206 ev and fol 261 ev) After the death of his first wife, Koert Albertz Winkel married for the send time soon after November 27, 1751, with Margje berentz Rouw, who was baptized in Hoogenveen on March 19, 1730 and bureid in Hoogeveen on April 30, 1778. This woman also gave birth to nine children, of whom again tow died prematurely. His seventh child by this woman was given the name Jan Uiterwijk born in Hoogeveen on March 8, 1767, and he is as such registered in the baptism-register of the church in Hoogeveen. The name of the clan was "Winkel" and arised the name Uiterwijk Winkel. We will never know why Koert Albertz Winkel gave this name to his son. He might have done this as an expression of respect for his late brother-in-law Jan Uiterwijk (1760), who was main guardian of the under-age children of this first marriage or he has named his son after his cousin Jan Uiterwijk, who was a son of his brother-in-law, and who could have married at the same tiem as his son was born.

His cousin Jan Uiterwijk was born in Hoogeveen on August 16, 1739. Decause if Church guardian in Hoogeveen on August 5, 1806, and before the year 1769 married with Aaltje, Jans ter Kley, born Hoogeveen October 14, 1742.

From the will, made by his parents-in-law Jan Gerrits ter Kley and Arentje, Berends Smit, we know that Jan Uiterwijk was married with Aaltje, Jans ten Kley. (Etsstoel 14 part 56-1 foli 40) This woman gave notification of the death of her husband on Auust 9, 1806, when he was 67 years old. He left two sisters behind. We can thus be sure that this branch of Uiterwijk has become extinct.

Coert Albertz, living in Alteveer (Drenthe) was member from the Church of Hooegeveen on December 25, 1686.

Children. (so far as known)

Born about the year 1680 Albert, Koertz, decaused before Mai 7, 1731.

Aaltien Koertz, decaused on Hooegeveen Mai 21, 1779. She was accepted by Church on September 25, 1712. Married before the year 1714 with Jacob, Harmz Koster, born Hooegeveen after 1684 and buried in Hooegeveen on Februari 01, 1761.
