Many of London famous Cathedrals. St Paul Church was made ready for a Thanksgiving service for the Jubilee. We saw pigeons every where even on the top of Abraham Lincoln's head a pigeon was roosting.

London is a busy city and it takes care every morning of 20,000 people who are posted to other different places of work from London. We went to Gravesend with a fast train and when the train stopped the boat was waiting for us. (Dartmouth) The sea was calm. we waited for daylight to come to see May 17 Rotterdam. What a thrill! the old soil! familiar sights boats, windmills. Dutch falcons missionaries where on the boat after our truck and suitcase we paid 1.70 in Dutch money to the driver. We rode in a taxi to head quarters and Dr & Leon + received us with kindness and gladness. more missionaries are needed. The twins are doing fine. We saw Rotterdam, changed our money, repacked our blinks and asked permission to go to our relatives and "brush" up our Dutch. We were very well received in The Hague received 2 letters from our girls. and were surprised to
